WHAT DO I HAVE TO BRING?

- Air mattress/sleeping bag/pillow

- Hat/sunscreen/bug spray/flashlight
- Bible and journal & draw string bag to carry them

WHERE WILL WE SHOWER? We will shower at the YMCA. They have a whole bunch of showers. So our whole group can get in and out in less than an hour.

EXPLAIN THIS WHOLE CAMPING THING AGAIN, BECAUSE ROUGHING IT TO ME IS A HOTEL WITHOUT ROOM SERVICE. You'll need to bring an air mattress either way. You'll sleep on that either in your tent or at the church. Both have toilets that flush. In both cases, the cooking is simple and you will barely know you are camping. WHEN?


JUNE 7-10, 2018 - Departing Thursday Evening (5PM) and returning Sunday evening (5PM).

COST?


\$125 per person. This includes all meals, activities, serving supplies and lodging.




WHERE CAN WE REGISTER?
