This represents our general ministry and operating budget over two years. We need to expand, strengthen and resource what we're already doing. And we must continue to invest in and develop our Children's Ministry, Student Ministry, Adult Discipleship Ministry, Worship Ministry and Outreach Ministry. These ministries are the backbone of who we are as a church.

NEXT STEPS

PRAY PERSISTENTLY

Pray that God will move in the hearts of His people at RiverTree Lake and that we will listen with the intent to obey. Pray huge, Uncharted, God-sized prayers for provision for ALL God desires to do through this initiative.

COMMIT FULLY

Help reach our goal of 100% engagement by putting your Uncharted 'yes' on the altar and encouraging others to do the same.

CELEBRATE LOUDLY

God is going to do amazing things in your life during this initiative. Share all that He is doing enthusiastically as He moves in us and through us.

GIVE GENEROUSLY

Live and give in a way that stretches you to take your faith and generosity to Uncharted waters.

GIVING JOURNEY

INITIAL GIVER

An Initial Giver is someone who decides to give for the first time, out of a response to God's Word about giving. This is someone who decides to give something and trust God and the leaders of the church with this gift.

PACIFI

CONSISTENT GIVER

A Consistent Giver is someone who decides to give something and give it consistently to exercise the discipline of giving regularly. Often, someone who decides to make their gift an online recurring gift will be someone who is learning the behavior of consistency. Non-online givers can be consistent givers as well of course; it just requires more discipline.

INTENTIONAL GIVER

An Intentional Giver is someone who begins to think about their giving in relation to other things on which they spend their money. For example, this type of giver begins asking the question, "Why am I giving more to AT&T than I am giving to God? Should I be giving to God more than I give for my mortgage each month?" This giver starts to make their giving an intentional choice that reflects how they prioritize and spend their money. This may be the point of intentionality when someone begins to tithe, reflecting intentionally about a certain amount/percentage they want to give to God.

SURRENDERED GIVER

A Surrendered Giver is someone who recognizes the cost Christ paid on the cross for us and is surrendered to honoring God with 100% of their resources as a result. A Surrendered Giver gives in a way that changes them. Their giving governs their spending/ saving rather than their spending/saving governing their giving. A Surrendered Giver isn't concerned with what they ARE giving but more concerned with what they're NOT giving and why. They seek to honor God with 100% of what He has given them, whether direct monetary giving or a God-honoring use of an existing resource like a home or a vehicle.

ETERNAL GIVER

An Eternal Giver is someone who is thinking about the longer tail of generosity rather than just the shorter term of monthto-month generosity or even year-to-year. An Eternal Giver makes decisions in the short term that have longer term effects as it relates to their generosity capacity. They think of what home they buy, what car they purchase, how much savings they choose to keep, all in relation to their generosity capacity. An Eternal Giver is driven by the things of eternity, putting their hope in God and not in the things of this earth.

ONE FUND (S)

What is a "one fund" initiative?

You may have been a part of church campaigns in the past during which you were asked to give a second gift 'above and beyond' your usual gifts to make special initiatives like new buildings and new ministries possible.

Normally, you gave that gift to the 'Building Fund' and you also continued to give offerings to the 'General Fund.' This type of giving is potentially confusing to people who either don't have a baseline for their "usual giving" or who aren't able to really celebrate the total giving they are engaging in at RiverTree Lake in one single number. We believe that it is all ONE MISSION that we're on – the mission of **making disciples of Jesus one person, one family, one neighborhood at a time**. So we as a leadership have decided that we're going to give our gifts to RiverTree Lake into one fund for this next season of ministry expansion – to celebrate the totality of our generosity growth as disciples of Jesus.

The Uncharted initiative will last for two years. In those two years, every gift that is given to RiverTree Lake will go to the key components of Uncharted: Beyond Ourselves and Beyond Our Walls. These areas are explained in detail in the pages of this booklet.

We've included a sample commitment card so you can begin to pray about your commitment and what that will mean for your journey with God. Please take time to think and pray through this, and then we will provide you with a new hard copy on Commitment Sunday, November 17.

WEEK 1 | MESSAGE NOTES UNCHARTED FAITH

GROUP GUIDE WEEK 1 – UNCHARTED FAITH

God's Promise, Abram's Faith

Opening Discussion Questions:

- 1. What are some of the preconceived assumptions you have about money and the Church?
- 2. What is a negative experience you have had regarding giving in the Church?
- 3. What is a positive experience you have had regarding giving in the Church?

Further Discussion from Scripture:

Read each Scripture passage below and discuss the questions as a group. You may want to have each group member journal their answer first in the lines provided below before discussing together, as a means of encouraging all to participate more deeply.

READ: Genesis 12:1-3

1. How would you feel if God asked you to uproot your life—leave all that you're most familiar with—and with your family go and experience a great promise He had for you?

- a. What would you be scared about?
- b. What would you be excited about?

2. God called Abraham (Abram at the time) to a life he could not yet see - to a path that was "Uncharted." Have you given God a 'blank check' with your life? Do you allow Him to do with your life what He wishes to do? Or do you seek to 'chart your own path?'

5. Do you feel you have already 'arrived' in the area of generosity, or do you still have room to grow?

3. To what do you look in order to ensure that your path tomorrow will be ok? Family? Friends? Money? Your career? Your talents and abilities? Where do you find your security in the present and for the future?

a. Are these things preventing you from truly being able to follow where God leads? How so?

6. What would your story of generosity look like in order to create a witness that honors and draws more people to God during this Uncharted season?

READ: Colossians 1:3-14

4. How would your generosity be affected if you had a full view in mind of what it looks like to truly follow God like Abraham and like Paul? What would giving generously in light of that actually mean?

Apply:

Look for an opportunity to step out in faith this week, even though you may not be able to see all the details. Converse with your group on what you feel God may be calling you into, through faith, and with a generous heart.

Pray:

- Pray that God would cultivate a spirit of willingness to step into Uncharted territories in your faith.
- Pray for God to reveal where you may be avoiding a heart of generosity in your life.

WEEK 2 | MESSAGE NOTES UNCHARTED TRUST

GROUP GUIDE WEEK 2 - UNCHARTED TRUST

A New Name for Abram

Opening Discussion Questions:

- 1. Why is it difficult to trust people? Why do we tend to have so many trust issues?
- 2. Can you think of a time when you trusted someone, and it turned out for the positive? What does it take in order for true trust to be present?

Further Discussion from Scripture:

Read each Scripture passage below and discuss the questions as a group. You may want to have each group member journal their answer first in the lines provided below before discussing together, as a means of encouraging all to participate more deeply.

READ: Genesis 15:1-6

1. Is there a circumstance in your life or in someone else's life in which God made the seemingly impossible possible?

a. Or perhaps you are still in a waiting and trusting mode about something God has promised to you through His Word... Is this your situation?

READ: Genesis 17:1-8

2. Why do you think it was so important that God changed Abram's name?

3. Do you ever feel you have been "named" by a situation of your past and that it limits your trust of God's promises for your future?

a. How might God be trying to "change your name" while He is leading you forward and asking you to trust Him?

4. As you think about this Uncharted journey and specifically the Uncharted commitment God is asking you to make, what strongholds, situations, or "names" from your past are preventing you from trusting in God fully as you make this Uncharted commitment?

a. How can your friends, family, or One Community pray for you in this, that God would release this stronghold from you and "give you a new name" as He leads you into this new path for your future?

APPLY:

Think about the things in life you would say are the most valuable to you. I'm sure things like God, family and friends came to mind. But what does your time and money say you value most? There's bound to be things like time or money being spent on Netflix or Facebook / Instagram, eating out, the latest and greatest technology, etc. Would you be willing to consider giving up one of these "fillers" and replacing it with something that benefits the Kingdom of God? Maybe the replacement is reading the Bible in silence, playing games with your family, budgeting to bless your neighbors with a need, etc. Consider how God may be asking you to get rid of the old and embrace the new.

PRAY:

- Ask God to remind you of the ways He has overcome circumstances in your life that you once called "impossible" or "insurmountable." Thank Him for meeting your needs in those moments.
- Pray for future obstacles that you or your family may face and ask that, despite the size of the situation, you would have faith that God is bigger.
- Pray for the Uncharted generosity initiative that we are embarking on. That although it is a bold initiative, RiverTree Lake would have faith in God and His provision over our church.



WEEK 3 | MESSAGE NOTES UNCHARTED PRIORITIES

GROUP GUIDE WEEK 3 - UNCHARTED PRIORITIES

Abraham's Path of Commitment

Opening Discussion Questions:

- 1. Who is the most "committed" person you know? To what are they committed?
- 2. What does commitment mean to you? To what are you committed?
- 3. When has commitment cost you or caused you to rearrange your priorities?

Further Discussion from Scripture:

Read each Scripture passage below and discuss the questions as a group. You may want to have each group member journal their answer first in the lines provided below before discussing together, as a means of encouraging all to participate more deeply.

READ: Genesis 13:1-17

1. Abraham clearly had different priorities than Lot in this situation. What were Abraham's priorities as outlined in this passage?

a. And what were Lot's priorities?

 There is a passage in Proverbs that states, "The world of the generous gets larger and larger; the world of the stingy gets smaller and smaller." (Proverbs 11:24 MSG). How does this truth play out in this passage?

5. Let's ask ourselves a convicting question: If you were God, would you give you more money? Why or why not?

3. In order for Abraham to be the generous man he was in this situation, he had to stay committed to following the ways of God. Do you feel you are committed to following the ways of God in terms of generosity? In what ways are you weak, uncommitted, or wavering?

4. As you think about the priority of your generosity to God's Kingdom, do you feel you are committed to generosity above your other financial priorities? Another way to put this might be, does your level of spending/ saving control your level of giving, or does your level of giving control your level of spending/saving? Be as honest as you possibly can.

READ: 2 Corinthians 9:10-15

APPLY:

Evaluate the pattern of generosity in your life and consider your answer to the question, "If you were God, would you give you more money?" If generosity is an area where you have struggled, ask God to provide you a way to practice generosity this week. It may be supporting the Uncharted generosity initiative, giving your time through volunteering, or using your skillset or trade to bless a friend / neighbor. There is no shortage of need for generosity.

PRAY:

• Ask God to encourage you in the ways that you've practiced generosity and to convict you in the ways that you have not.



WEEK 4 | MESSAGE NOTES UNCHARTED SURRENDER

GROUP GUIDE WEEK 4 - UNCHARTED SURRENDER

Tested Faith

Opening Discussion Questions:

- 1. What have you sacrificed in your life? What did that mean for you?
- 2. What would be very difficult to give up something that if you were asked to give up, you're not sure you could?
- 3. Have you ever been changed by a sacrifice you've made?

Further Discussion from Scripture:

Read each Scripture passage below and discuss the questions as a group. You may want to have each group member journal their answer first in the lines provided below before discussing together, as a means of encouraging all to participate more deeply.

READ: Genesis 22:1-18

1. So after Abraham waits so long for a son, God now asks him to be willing to sacrifice his son Isaac on the altar of the Lord – how does this make any sense?! How is this fair?!

a. What emotions are going through your head and your heart right now after reading this passage?

2. It is tempting for Abraham to believe (or for any of us to believe) that

anything given to us by God is OURS, not His. How does this passage remind you of things in your own life that you do not view completely surrendered to God but still as yours?

3. What is preventing you from surrendering to God and His plan for your life in a way that seems Uncharted to you? What is preventing you from being fully surrendered to Him and trusting Him into the Uncharted?

4. Do you believe God can and WILL do something THROUGH you and IN you during this Uncharted season? How do you think God is seeking to use you and your resources in a way that brings glory to Him and shines light on His name, even when you may not know the specific path ahead? He is asking you to trust Him and surrender to Him. Will you?

READ: Hebrews 12:1-3

5. To run the race with Christ means committing to it and not growing weary. Jesus gave His life for us because of the joy set before Him in heaven. When you think about your response to that type of sacrifice and Jesus' call upon our lives to run the race as we are "surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses," how does that influence your thoughts regarding your Uncharted commitment and the impact it might have?

6. The fact that Jesus humbled Himself by succumbing to a human death and becoming the ultimate sacrifice for our sins demands a response from us. What will your response be? Surrendering your life to Jesus is not just about agreeing to follow Him; it is about actually following Him. Following His example and living as He did. If someone who didn't know you looked at your financial commitments, what would they say you are surrendered to? Would that statement be true about you? Or is there something that needs to be explained or modified as you think about this Uncharted season ahead?

APPLY:

Evaluate your relationship with God this week. Do you see a consistent willingness to live your life to complete God's commands like the Great Commission, loving your neighbor, caring for the weak, etc.? If not, maybe something is in the way and God is asking you to remove it. Consider asking God what it may be in your life that He is asking you to remove? Addictions, unforgiveness, anger, resentment, etc.?

PRAY:

- Express your gratefulness to God for His generosity in your life; ultimately that He would give His one and only Son to ensure your salvation.
- Pray that God would show you where your faith is small, then ask Him to grow your faith in Him.

Pray over your commitment as you prepare to bring your card forward on Commitment Sunday, November 17.

Prayer is the most important thing in this whole process, and prayer is what gives us the bold heart of Christ within us.

Now let's do this, RiverTree Lake.

Let's be people who are boldly trusting Him into the Uncharted!



WEEK 5 | MESSAGE NOTES UNCHARTED BELIEF

GROUP GUIDE WEEK 5 - UNCHARTED BELIEF

Tested Faith

Opening Discussion Questions:

- 1. Have you ever been the only person who believed something when no one else did?
- 2. Would you consider yourself a person of belief or a person who struggles with unbelief?
- 3. What is one hope, one prayer you have for RiverTree Lake as we embark on this two-year Uncharted journey? Write these down as a group as we prepare to make our commitments this weekend.

Further Discussion from Scripture:

Read each Scripture passage below and discuss the questions as a group. You may want to have each group member journal their answer first in the lines provided below before discussing together, as a means of encouraging all to participate more deeply.

READ: Genesis 18:16-32

1. Something to remember as we talk about this story is that Jesus had not come yet as an atoning sacrifice for the world. When Jesus came and the gospel story was fulfilled, He literally paid for the sins of the whole world - of every single woman and man - so that people in cities would not have to be destroyed by God as a result of their sin. But God uses stories in the Old Testament like this one with Abraham and Sodom to remind us it is important for us to pray big, bold prayers, believing God will act on our prayers in accordance with His word.

a. Would you say you are a person of big belief in what God can do?
Do you pray big, bold prayers?

2. This Uncharted journey is not about raising 2.5 million dollars. Any of us who still think that have totally missed the point. This Uncharted journey is about 100% of us going before God and determining what a big, bold, believing faith, a humble spirit, and a sacrificing heart looks like as it relates to our generosity. It is about 100% of us laying it on the line for God and holding nothing back.

a. Is this what you are doing for Uncharted? Is this how you have been thinking about your giving and your sacrifice? Are you going to believe God will use you to navigate people to Him in ways He has never done before in your life? Reflect on this and share your heart, thoughts, nervousness, excitement, prayers with your group. 4. Big, bold, humble, sacrificial prayers are what move mountains for God. Write some of those big prayers of belief you have for RiverTree Lake in the next two years. Write them out, and then pray with your group about each one in a bold, believing fashion, believing God can and will fulfill these prayers in accordance with His Word.

READ: Ephesians 3:14-21

5. List your current financial commitments - those which go beyond a one-time payment and have a time duration to them. Examples would be a home mortgage, a lease agreement, a car loan, a cell phone contract, your child's tuition for school, your own tuition for school, etc

3. How can your One Community pray for you as you make your Uncharted commitment this upcoming weekend?

- 6. List the commitment you are planning to make for the Uncharted initiative.
 - a. Where does it fall in the priority of these other commitments?
 - b. Do you need to change one or more of these other commitments to be able to fulfill your Uncharted commitment?
 - c. Do you have a current financial commitment hindering you from making a sacrificial commitment?

7. If someone who didn't know you looked at your financial commitments, what would they say you value?

a. Would that statement be true about you? Or is there something that needs to be explained or modified?

10. How will you leverage this change to influence others such as your children, your co-workers, your friends, your family, people in your circles of influence?

APPLY:

Evaluate your relationship with God this week, and see what steps you need to take to grow your faith in Christ. Those steps could look like reading the Bible, praying, serving others, or asking a mature believer to mentor you.

PRAY:

- Ask God to bring you situations that will stretch your faith and prompt you to pray big, bold prayers.
- Pray that God would enter into every area of your life and that nothing would be withheld from His influence.



8. "Choose this day whom you will serve." (Joshua 24:15). Choose to make your giving to God the type of priority you want it to be. What will that mean for your Uncharted commitment?

9. If you keep this commitment over the next two years, what spiritual change will occur in you?

GROUP GUIDE WEEK 6 - UNCHARTED LEGACY

Abraham's Legacy

Opening Discussion Questions:

- 1. How would you define the word "legacy?"
- 2. If you could look back on your life, what would a positive legacy look like? What would a negative legacy look like?

Further Discussion from Scripture:

Read each Scripture passage below and discuss the questions as a group. You may want to have each group member journal their answer first in the lines provided below before discussing together, as a means of encouraging all to participate more deeply.

READ: Genesis 22:1-19

1. What are some details in this chapter that really challenged you? What questions do you have?

a. What are some details that you really like from this chapter?

2. What legacy did Abraham leave by trusting God despite the weighty sacrifices required?

- a. What was the impact of your faith?
- b. Can you imagine if you would have just given up? What would you have lost out on? Growth, faith, maturity, closeness with God, legacy?

6. If we are to accomplish our goals of the Uncharted journey (first, 100% participation and second, raising 2.5 million dollars), can you imagine the great legacy God could leave through our church?

a. What are your hopes and dreams for what God could accomplish through RiverTree Lake if we meet our Uncharted goals through His provision?

4. What life do you want to look back on? One where you persevered in faith or one where you gave up whenever things got tough?

a. Why? What motivates you to leave a legacy of faith behind?

READ: Hebrews 11:6-19

7. Hebrews 11 is known as the Faith Hall of Fame. Who in this chapter sticks out to you as a great example of faith? Why? How did their situation require great faith?

5. What impact has RiverTree Lake had on you and your family?

- 8. What were some of the legacies that those mentioned left?
 - a. When you think about people like Noah and Abraham, were they perfect? Did they ever leave a bad legacy?

b. Do you believe that despite your mistakes you too could leave a legacy of faith?

9. How important is it to you to leave a great legacy? What are some steps you could take this week to work towards a greater legacy? How could you take this week to work towards a greater legacy?

APPLY:

Commit yourself to a life that will leave a great legacy. Ask God to reveal one step you can take this week towards that commitment. This next step could be something like reading the Bible more regularly, spending more intentional time in prayer, making a sacrifice in a specific relationship, practicing generosity like never before, or asking a mature believer to mentor you. Allow the Holy Spirit to guide you in this process.

PRAY:

- Express your gratefulness to God for His generosity in your life; ultimately that He would give His one and only Son to ensure your salvation.
- Pray that God would show you where your faith is small, then ask Him to grow your faith in Him.

If we are committing to Uncharted, how does this change my giving to missions, the general fund, and other special offerings?

How long is my commitment?

We are asking that everyone make a two-year commitment. The fulfillment period for your commitment will begin with our First Big Give on Sunday, December 8, 2019 and it will culminate in December of 2021.

What if I don't have a job right now? What does that mean for my Uncharted commitment?

Uncharted is about your total, faith-filled, surrendered generosity to God's mission through RiverTree Lake. We believe that God calls us to action in times of hardship just as much as He does in times of abundance, and that looks different for every person. Uncharted is about a heart change – one that is only accomplished by surrendering our lives completely over to God in this area of giving. So that may mean that you are being challenged to sell things, to pick up odd jobs, or even to trust God in faith by making a commitment that you don't quite know how to fulfill right now but that you believe God will provide for as you seek for ways to sacrifice and work towards that commitment. We would love for 100% of us to be a part of Uncharted so that we can all be supporting, loving, encouraging, and praying for one another through this spiritually-stretching season at RiverTree Lake.

What if I am severely in debt right now? Am I still supposed to give?

If you are someone currently seeking to make payments to pay off debt right now, we commend you for making progress on that. And you should continue to do so. We would be happy to help you in this journey and/or to recommend a budgeting class that might minister to you. Being in debt does not, however, make someone "excused" from giving. Giving isn't about what

God wants from you; rather, it's about what God wants for you. So it should be our joy and privilege to give at all times. Please contact us if you need assistance with this or if you would like to speak with a budgeting counselor, and we would be honored to help.

What if I have never even given to RiverTree Lake before?

Uncharted was crafted specifically with you in mind. Uncharted is a "one fund" generosity initiative, meaning that it is different from a traditional capital campaign where you are called to give an extra gift above and beyond your normal giving – thus creating two steps for people who aren't yet giving. Uncharted is a call to surrendered, faith-filled generosity for absolutely everyone at RiverTree Lake. If you have never given before, this is your chance to get in the game with a committed sacrifice. We really hope you will.

What if I am new around here?

Uncharted is about the vision for our church and our personal discipleship in giving as followers of Jesus. What if I haven't been baptized yet?

Others begin going to a One Community before they begin talking to God in prayer. Giving is another spiritual step, and it comes at different times for different people. One thing is for sure, however. Just like other spiritual disciplines, giving draws us closer to God. And God is calling ALL of us to give. Where your treasure is, there your heart will be also. (Matthew 6:19) Whether you have taken the spiritual step of baptism or whether you haven't yet, we would encourage you to still join us in this Uncharted initiative.
