WildSide Dismissal Policy:

First, we never want to see a student sent home. We truly believe that students are at WildSide for a reason – to have their life impacted positively. Therefore we only consider sending a student home from WildSide as a last resort.

Second, as parents, and guardians, we want you to know that we care deeply for all the students that come under our care during WildSide.

Thirdly, we also want you to know that communication is important to us. So if we do run into difficulty with your son or daughter consistently disregarding camp rules then we will contact you and brainstorm with you how to proceed.

Finally, we don't make too many rules at WildSide. We try to make things simple for students and allow them to have fun and be safe. However, the rules we do have we enforce and we make sure we communicate the rules to students so there is no confusion.

These four ideas hopefully have given you an idea of our heart on the matter of dismissal. However rare, there are times when it becomes necessary for a student to be sent home. If this occurs, parents and guardians are responsible to provide transportation home for the student.

The sorts of things that would cause a student to be dismissed include:

- § Student uses illegal drugs, alcohol, or tobacco during the trip.
- § Student violates state or federal law (theft, assault, vandalism etc...)

§ Student performs any act that endangers others, in particular bullying or continually disregarding waterfront safety.

We have read and discussed the dismissal policy and agree to the terms.
