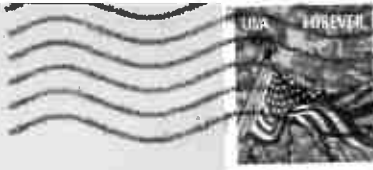

WDJQ,

I'm writing this letter to praise your engineering department for having what I believe is the best sounding station in the area. I used to do some stuff for an internet stream, and I know how hard it is to find something that works well, and that didn't even account for working within the constraints of the FM broadcast band. There's a nice consistent and very transparent compressor at work there, but even the best equipment won't sound very good if people don't know how to use it. WHBC is close, but there is some issues with clipping and distortion at times. WDJQ manages to sound good while not being too quiet, dynamic without being too varying in its levels, consistent but not overprocessed. It's such a tough balance, a very fine line between overprocessed and underprocessed. WDJQ comes damn close to sounding as good as "the big boys" such as WCBS in New York. New York had some very good sounding stations out there, and WDJQ is the closest to matching those. Whoever is handling the processing or engineering for 99.2 is a very capable and talented person with a good ear, and I wanted to make sure credit goes where it's due. I also wrote a letter to WHOT to ask them to fix issues they've had for years now. They sound TERRIBLE! Sorry, I'm not a loyal listener, I'm a radio whore. I like too many types of music to stick to one station, but I sure wish more stations would sound as good as yours. WDJQ beats any Youngstown, Pittsburgh, Akron/Canton, Cleveland and Wheeling station I get here for sound quality. Kudos to you.
